**Sacramento, CA, April 22, 2022**: Sacramento Area Bike Advocates (SABA) invites the Sacramento community to attend the 22<sup>nd</sup> Annual Bicycle Film Festival (BFF) on May 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> at the Twin Rivers Cider, Sacramento. Those who are unable to attend may still view the film festival virtually. The pre-event celebration starts with a bike ride in the morning to the film event with an all-day engaging agenda of fun, film, food, and music by Hard Luck Daddy's. The second day of the event includes the continuation of the Mother's Day Brunch and activities for children. Sponsors of the event include – Sacramento TMA, Caltrans, Balanced Body, Sacramento Regional Transit, Practical Quality Services, Weintraub Tobin, and SABA.

The Bicycle Film Festival was created when the founder, Brendt Barbur, was struck by a bus in New York City when he was riding his bike. His mission was to take this crash and turn "his negative experience into a positive one."

"In 2001, Barbur started the Bicycle Film Festival as a platform to celebrate the bicycle through music, art, and, of course, film. The Bicycle Film Festival has been a major catalyst for the urban bike movement, one of the most powerful and culturally relevant forces of the last decade." – BFF

SABA acknowledges the importance of bike safety and the significance of bicycle infrastructure, so cyclists have safe routes when riding on the roadways. Deb Banks, Executive Director of SABA states that "Sacramento has the potential to be the best cycling city in California, and while we've made progress, there's plenty still to do. We believe in the power of the bicycle and its potential to both change people's lives and the world."

The event coincides with May is Bike Month, a regional event for individuals, teams, and workplaces from across the Sacramento Region. May is Bike Month celebrates bicycling as a form of transportation, while encouraging riders of all levels to join in for some friendly competition, chances to win prizes, and to help make the Sacramento Region a cleaner and greener place.

The May is Bike Month Challenge is open to any and all residents of the Sacramento Region, or anyone who works in the area, and is free to take part. **It kicks off on May 1**<sup>st</sup> **and runs until May 31**<sup>st</sup>. Registration is free and now open at MayisBikeMonth.com
